One way of doing this is: Dbs.MoveFirst Do While Dbs.EOF s = Dbs.Fields("colum1").Value f = Server.CreateObject("ADODB.File") f.Type = adTypeText f.WriteText s 'DO WHAT EVER YOU WANT TO DO WITH THE FILE Dbs.Next Loop And another way is to use ADODB.Stream Dbs.MoveFirst Do While Dbs.EOF s = Dbs.Fields("colum1").Value
